IS THE BOOK OF MORMON SUPPORTED BY SECULAR HISTORY?

The Bible speaks of many cities which are in existence today or whose ruins have been discovered: Jerusalem, Babylon, Damascus, Ashkelon, Sidon, Tyre, etc. The veracity of an account may be checked by comparing historical evidences such as city names. Obviously, "Babylon" is not validated by the existence of "Babylon, New York", so the investigation must confine itself to cities within the geographic area of interest. How does the Book of Mormon stack up? Many cities on the U.S. East coast have identical names to those in England, so the State of Utah must be excluded in finding the original cities listed in the Book of Mormon. The following is a compilation of all city names listed in the Book of Mormon followed by the phrase "city of".
